Food For The Poor Nutritional Center

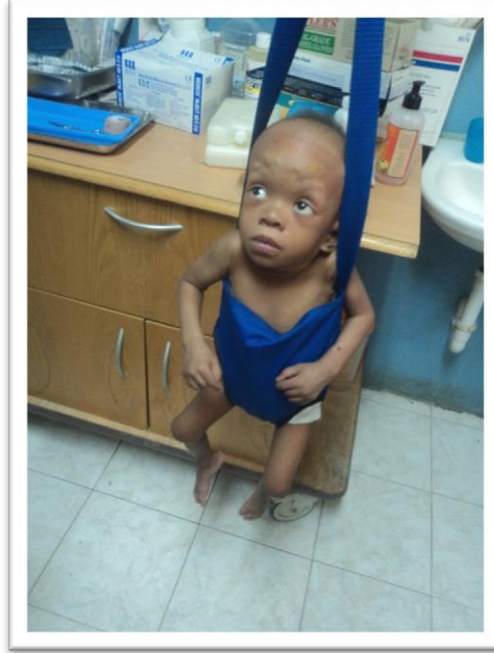
The Nutritional Center received its first Hope Gel donation in 2015. The supplement has proven to be highly satisfactory. The center has been able to save the lives of several children who suffered from acute malnutrition with this donation.

Health agents actively screened children in the community for malnourishment by using the brachial perimeter. The parents would be given a reference card to bring to the nutritional center for treatment. Some of the children arrived in a critical state and were not thought to make it from one minute to the next. Upon arrival at the center further testing would be done by nurses as part of the enrollment process. Charts were then created to track the progress of the children and the children were started on the Hope Gel regimen.

Alpachino is 12 months old and weighed just 12 lbs when he was first referred to the nutrition center. Alpachino’s mom is a single mom of 3 children. His 2 siblings are able to attend school for free while he is at home with mom. With lack of means of support, it is not unusual for Alpachino to go days without food to eat. Since the donation of Hope Gel he is progressing from the malnutrition state he was found in.
